EL DISCURSO DE APERTURA.

Para terminar la rápida ojeada que hemos venido dando a los principales puntos que tocó el Presidente de la República en su discurso del 1.º del corriente, solo nos resta decir algo ahora acerca de lo que él contiene sobre el ramo de colonización y sobre la reforma de la ley de Municipalidades.

Con respecto al primer punto, después de declarar su Escelencia que la colonización e inmigración continúan siendo uno de los más graves problemas de nuestra actual industrial y económica, y que el objeto de las colonias extranjeras en el territorio de Arauco es dar la norma de un progreso más adelantado que el nuestro al resto de la población nacional que se desarrolla en aquella región, y también producir la inmigración espontánea, agrega que los frutos obtenidos son relativamente satisfactorios.

Todo lo cual, o es ocioso, o está en abierta contradicción con hechos y cifras que son del dominio público. Porque es perfectamente sabido, como que consta de los informes oficiales pasados por el director del ramo de colonización, que los pocos colonos que, con gastos enormes, se han hecho venir al país, no han dado hasta ahora ni señales de sus progresos más adelantados que el nuestro, y que los esfuerzos de los más laboriosos y progresistas se han limitado a seguir las huellas de los propietarios chilenos del territorio araucano, criando como ellos vacas, ovejas, cerdos y otros animales, y aves de corral, y sembrando, por los mismos procedimientos de los nacionales y de los indios, trigo, maíz, papas, arvejas, garbanzos, lentejas, etc.

Se sabe además que, a fin de instalar a un puñado de colonos extranjeros, se ha obligado a abandonar el territorio, en proporción de diez por cada uno, a una multitud de chilenos tan laboriosos e inteligentes como los extranjeros, y con títulos mucho mejores que ellos para ser propietarios en Chile.

Y su Escelencia, que nada dice de esta emigración provocada por el desahucio y antipatriótico sistema de colonización seguido hasta la fecha con empobrecimiento increíble, que guarda discreto silencio sobre lo que consta al país esa colonización de aparato, declara, sin embargo, que los frutos obtenidos por ella son relativamente satisfactorios.

Relativamente a qué se preguntará al público, como nos preguntamos nosotros al leer esta parte del discurso presidencial.

Relativamente al tiempo a que estamos gastando y trabajando en la empresa?—No puede ser, porque ha naciones, como la República Argentina, sin ir más lejos, que a ese respecto en un solo mes de año pasado han conseguido más abundantes frutos que nosotros en diez años.

O relativamente a los fondos que en la empresa llevamos ya gastados? Mucho menos, porque, en presencia de las enormes sumas invertidas, de los vérdulos de las tierras obsecuadas y de los peores que implica para el país la emigración de nuestros nacionales, esos frutos más que escasos, llegan a aparecer como insignificantes y ridículos.

No, es preciso repetir—puedo que hai empeño en disminuir la cuestión, a fin de persistir en un sistema que permita favorecer con gruesas y cómodas prebendas a unos cuantos favoritos e instrumentos,—los frutos producidos hasta ahora por la llamada colonización de Arauco son completamente malos, porque Chile, que cuenta en su seno con capitalistas grandes y pequeños que en su deseo de hacerse propietarios en Arauco, han llegado a ofrecer por las tierras de aquella comarca cada vez que se han sacado a venta, precios inverosímiles,—tales cuantos no se podrían obtener en el centro por terrenos de secano de regular clase,—porque Chile, repetimos, no tiene derecho de obsequiar esas tierras a nadie, y a los extranjeros menos que a nadie, y con perjuicio de sus hijos, con el perjuicio de que hai otros que saben sembrar trigo y criar vacas mejor que ellos, muchísimo mejor todavía.

La tierra de Chile para los chilenos, mientras haya chilenos que las solíciten y las paguen para cultivarlas tan bien por lo menos como los extranjeros; tal debe ser nuestra divisa en materia de colonización.

Lo demás, como por ejemplo, lo que dice su Escelencia un poco más adelante, echándole de jeneroso o de magnánimo, que puede darse cierta cabida en Arauco a la colonización nacional, es verdaderamente un sarcasmo; es como pretender consolar a hombres a quienes se hubiese despojado de sus casas para cederlas a extranjeros y desconocidos, con decirles bondadosamente: Pueden alojarse ustedes, si no encuentran alojamiento mejor, en el sagrún y debajo de los aleros!

No son menos dignos de crítica los párrafos que el discurso dedica a la ley nueva de Municipalidades. El tono de disminución de ironía, con que habla del atrevido ensayo que en materia de independencia local implica la ampliación de las facultades de los primeros alcaldes, no es propio ciertamente para desvanecer la creencia que desde que se discutió la reforma abrigamos muchos de que la actitud del Gobierno entonces respondía al propósito bien madurado de desacreditar la idea de la autonomía municipal con modificaciones calculadas a ese intento.

Por eso se negó tenazmente el Gobierno a aceptar todas las reformas que se propusieron, encaminadas a hacer menos completa la servidumbre de los cabildos, y por eso y para eso se autorizó la dudosa administración en los Municipios, agregando a los gobernadores, agentes inmediatos del Presidente de la República, otros agentes mediatos, pero no menos diles y mucho más cómodos, con el nombre de primeros alcaldes.

El Presidente nos declara, con cierta solemnidad, que espera ver los resultados de la atrevida innovación; ¿cómo es no estar ya en la vista de todo el mundo? Los resultados son tan pronto de pronto, como que dice, tiene el Presidente de la República dos agentes electorales de primera magnitud en cada departamento,—sin contar con el juez,—en vez del solo gobernador que antes tenía; que tendrá, por lo tanto, un doble número de medios que distribuir entre los que bien lo sirvan, y que, para remate y colmo de fortuna,
