LONDON 1st.—The wife of Sir Horace Rumbold, British Minister at Athens, appeals to England on behalf of the people of Greece, who are in distress in consequence of the mobilization of troops and the enrolment of laborers for military service.

The banking house of Rothschild has issued a Brazilian loan of 600,000 pounds, interest five per cent, per cent.

PARIS 1st.—The Committee of the Chamber of Deputies has approved M. Reve's proposal to leave to the Government the initiative in the expulsion of the French priests.

BERLIN 1st.—The Hamburger Nachrichten says that 400 Socialists of Altona have been sentenced to four years imprisonment for having distributed prohibited journals.

Madame Broeckel, wife of the director of the Kiel Telegraph, has been arrested on the charge of being an accomplice of Captain Sarau, convicted of furnishing the French authorities with information about German fortifications.

PARIS 2nd.—The French journal Le Siecle charges the official Panama Bulletin with suppressing
